Electoral Roll

The Electoral Roll for churches is renewed every five years, requiring everyone to re-register. This roll is the parish church's register of electors, similar to the civic Electoral Roll for voting in national and local elections. By joining the Church Electoral Roll at St Margaret's, you gain the right to

- vote on church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM), and
- stand for election to the Parochial Church Council (PCC).

Being on the Electoral Roll does not make you a "member" of the Church; you are a member simply by considering St Margaret's your spiritual home. You do not have to join the Electoral Roll to be an active member of St Margaret's and joining does not add extra commitments but helps demonstrate the church's strength, with representation on governing bodies dependent on the number of people on the Electoral Roll.

To join, you must be baptised,

- 16 years old or older on the APCM date and submit a signed application.
- You must also be a member of the Church of England or a church in communion with it, or a member of a church that upholds the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and willing to declare themselves a member of the Church.

Forms will be available at the back of church and also on our website where you can complete it online.
